In the last 24 months, we tripled our reach across Wisconsin & Illinois — now in 13 counties with 35 REDgen school chapters fostering resilience and mental wellness for over 21,000 students.



We launched **The Art of Resilience**, our signature event celebrating student voices and mental health journeys. Twenty student artists stood in courage and shared their stories through art.

We certified 8 QPR Gatekeeper Instructors, expanding our capacity to deliver suicide prevention training — so every REDgen peer leader is equipped to support their peers in times of need.

REDgen's school based initiative (Roots of Resilience) seeks to improve youth mental health and well-being, prevent crisis and reduce the stigma around mental health. Our model leverages the power of peer-to-peer influence, which research has proven to be the most impactful for fostering help seeking behavior, as well as a pathway to building strong and healthy relationships.

We are proud to announce that, in partnership with behavioral psychology researchers from Boston College, we have recently completed a comprehensive update to our Roots of Resilience curriculum—ensuring it reflects the most current, evidence-based practices in youth mental health and resilience education.


